#### INFORMATION AND ADVICE TO HELP YOU SUCCEED IN YOUR STUDIES

### The five-week program includes:

- 3 hours of class per day, from Monday to Friday (for a total of 90 hours).
- Evaluations, which allow us to paint a better picture of each student's progress, and to better support the student's learning.
- Mandatory workshops, twice a week
- Free optional sociocultural activities and special non-free activities are also offered. They are not compulsory and take place during the afternoon, evening and on weekends.
