2. BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL

2.1 Placement test

Once your admission process has been completed, you will receive an e-mail outlining the placement test procedures. Your result on the placement test will determine in which level you will be placed for the 5-week program. You will receive an e-mail indicating your choice of course based on your test result. **N.B.** Make sure to check your junk mail folder.

Important

• Take the **test without any help** so that the **level** in which you are placed can be **as accurate as possible**.

2.2 Special needs

2.3 Monportail.ulaval.ca

You will receive your IDUL (Identifiant Université Laval) by e-mail from the Registrar's Office. This e-mail will also invite you to create your NIP (ULAVAL password) (link).

With your IDUL and NIP, you'll have access to <u>monportail.ulaval.ca</u>. On this site, you can access your course sites, get your transcript, student card and official documents.

2.4 Student card

You will receive a message on <u>monPortail</u> or on your ulaval.ca email address, inviting you to submit a photo for your <u>digital</u> UL student card. Go on <u>carte-identite</u> to complete the process. Your student card will be available on the same address. We recommend you download the application.

2.5 Select your mandatory workshop preferences

Each week, students must participate in a conversation workshop and in another one mandatory thematic workshop selected from a list posted online. In all, students take part in two compulsory workshops per week. Each workshop lasts between one hour and half and two hours. Students will receive their workshop schedule during first week.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

On the first day of classes, you must be present at **7:45 am in the main entrance of pavillon De-Koninck** (avenue des Sciences-Humaines).

Explore student: You cannot arrive on the first day of the programme or thereafter. You must arrive at least one day before the course.

4. TRANSPORTATION

4.1 City transit (Réseau de transport de la Capitale - RTC)

RTC, Quebec transportation system, is easy to use, safe and efficient.

You can pay for a single use (cash or with the <u>RTC Nomade payment application</u>) or buy a daily, weekly or monthly pass. The monthly pass applies from the first day of the month (Example: June 1 - June 30).

Important: there is no RTC special student fare for FLE 5-week students. RTC rate chart.

Download the Nomade application (RTC Nomade Temps réel) to track buses in real time.

4.2 Via Rail discount

Explore students have a discount at the time of booking for almost all classes on all trains operated by VIA Rail. The procedure and documents concerning this promotion will be sent by email few days after your registration.

PROGRAM & SCHEDULE

Classes are held in the mornings from Monday to Friday, with the last Saturday of the session.

CREDIT COURSES

You will receive an e-mail to make your course selection after completing the placement test. Your schedule will be available online before classes start: sitescours.monportail.ulaval.ca/cours.

Not-for-credit courses

Your schedule will be sent to you a few days before the beginning of the semester.

6. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

When not in class or in their <u>mandatory workshops</u>, students practice French by participating in a wide variety of workshops and sociocultural activities.

Most of the workshops and activities offered are free.

6.1 Optional sociocultural activities

We offer more than 70 free activities and workshops each term. These free optional activities are perfect opportunities to speak French, discover Quebec area and francophone culture.

Students sign up on the day of the activity in the "Espace interculturel DKN-1211"

More details will be provided upon your arrival.

6.2 Special paying activities

These activities will occur during evenings and Saturdays.

We recommend that you bring around \$150 to cover expenses for such outings.

Prepayment or deposit required.

Places are limited. We recommend that you buy online as soon as possible.

2. In person

Students can buy the tickets that are remaining during the first week of classes. We are taking cash only.

ON-CAMPUS UNIVERSITY RESIDENCES

The buildings are open 24/7, and some of staff members speak English.

7.1 Inclusion in residence's room

- 1 single bed, without air conditioning.
- Bedding (bedspread, sheets, pillows and pillowcases) that can be changed once a week.
- Desk and lamp, phone, bookshelf, desk chair, armchair, dresser, closet, and draperies.
- Refrigerator.

Note: There is no air conditioning in the room. We recommend you bring a portable fan for July and August.

7.2 Residence facilities

- Free Wireless internet access.
- Laundry rooms and equipment.
- Bathrooms and showers are located close to the rooms on all floors.
- Modern shared kitchens include stoves, microwaves.
- Storage lockers for student's personal cookware (cookware not provided by the Université Laval's residences)
- Security service is provided around the clock, and all rooms are equipped with fire extinguishers and smoke detectors.

Students are responsible for any damage and costs related to extra room services.

Additional information for Explore program students

You are expected to check in at the pavillon Alphonse-Marie-Parent (open 24/7)

Explore students have to arrive no later than the night before the first day of the program and they have to be present until the last day of the program. The bursary covers a maximum of 35 nights. The bursary recipients may choose to stay longer and pay for the additional nights (\$19,43/night*).

Parking

8. FOOD

There are different options for buying food on the campus and in the area.

8.1 Grocery store

Three large grocery stores, *Metro, IGA* and *Provigo*, are within a 10-minute walk from the campus. They offer delivery to the campus, and sell a wide variety of natural and organic products, as well as prepared dishes.

Computer labs

10.1 Credit courses

The number of credits awarded per session are 6 credits (90 hours) or 3 credits (45 hours)
